	Between the entry and exit questionnaires, there was some change, but very little, in response to question #1, "I		
	watch horror films for pleasure regularly." The data suggest that most of the students entered the class with a		
	positive attitude toward horror films, and that the class did little or nothing to change this subjective perception		
	of the subject matter. Much greater change was found in the remaining questions, which deal with students'		
	ability to analyze, interpret, and critique films; students' perception of horror films as artistic, culturally		

significant, and reflective of the human condition; and students' understanding of the history of the genre. On questions 2-10 of the exit questionnaire, almost all students answered "strongly agree" or "agree," with the sole anomaly being 5 "uncertain" responses to question 7, "I am able to identify the criteria I use when I analyze a horror film." While there were a total of 36 responses in the "disagree" and "strongly disagree" categories for all questions on the entry questionnaire, there were only 4 such responses in the exit questionnaire. "Uncertain"

responses dropped from 75 on the entry questionnaire to 15 on the exit questionnaire.

- 4. For each outcome assessed, indicate the standard of success used, and the percentage of students who achieved that level of success. Here the standard of success is defined on the Master Syllabus as students' increasing their scores on the questionnaires "by .3 on the average survey score: for example 4.1 to 4.4". All students surveyed achieved this outcome overall. In fact they moved beyond it, if the standard of success were defined as students' responding to the exit questionnaire items with either "agree" or "strongly agree" answers. For all answers on the exit questionnaire, there was a 92% success rate as defined by this standard. Only question 7, mentioned above, had a significantly lower indicator of success, 75%.
- 5. Describe the areas of strength and weakness in students' achievement of the learning outcomes shown in assessment results.

Strengths: Students' self-reporting of their appreciation of and ability to understand horror cinema grew notably from the beginning of the semester to the end. Students reported gaining confidence in their ability to analyze horror films, comprehend their artistic merits, understand their relevance to personal and cultural enrichment, and have an awareness of the historical developments of the genre. Over all, they took a film genre they enjoyed and learned to translate that appreciation into academic terms.

Weaknesses: "I am able to identify the criteria I use when I analyze a horror film" was the only question which seemed to indicate confusion or lack of success on the students' part.
