### **Change Information:**

**Rationale:** This course will offer students a gateway to dance by introducing a variety of styles and in a single class with an exploration of both dance techniques and choreography. Change of credits to 3-credits for proposed transfer to EMU/elsewhere.

#### Proposed Start Semester: Fall 2023

**Course Description:** In this course, students will explore the techniques of modern, ballet, jazz, popular, and diverse world dance styles, based on essential movement disciplines. Having obtained a basic proficiency, students in this applied dance course will explore individual techniques and artistic group choreography to advanced-beginning or intermediate level. Dance performances and collaborations will be determined based on student interests and learning styles. This course is the second part of a two-course sequence and may be completed for credit up to two times.

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## **Course Objectives**

- 1. Demonstrate three specific dance movements from each genre.
- 2. Identify the core technical elements that make up each dance style presented.
- 3. Choreograph a set of movements in each discipline presented in class.
- 4. Demonstrate dance movements as an expression of culture.
- 5. Discuss cultural and historical context of each dance styles performed in class.
- 6. Conduct immersion research on the role of dance in one or more specific culture.
- 7. Express the role of dance as therapy to mental/emotional well-being.
- 8. Express the musical elements present in the dance works for final performance.
- 9. Show a basic understanding of the role music has in dance choreography.
